

Tools for Schools St. Lucie serves the need of children throughout the St. Lucie Public School system by providing donated school supplies. This rewarding opportunity not only helps the students but the teachers by alleviating the worry of inequity when planning classroom projects.

Tools for Schools believes every student should have the access to the tools they need to succeed, regardless of income.

\$71,482 in supplies to benefit more than 14,000 students each year.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

Creating opportunities through financial stability is a pillar of the United Way of St. Lucie & Okeechobee. This empowers hardworking families with the tools, training, and opportunities to prosper.



The IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program offers free basic tax return preparation to qualified individuals. VITA sites offer free tax help to:

- People who generally make \$58,000 or less
- · Persons with disabilities; and
- Limited English- speaking taxpayers

While the IRS manages the VITA program, the sites are operated by IRS partners such as the United Way and staffed by IRS- certified volunteers. VITA services are not only free, but a reliable and trusted source for preparing for tax returns.

- \$1.3 million in tax refunds returned to the community






