United Way was established in 1887 in Denver, CO, by a woman, a priest, two ministers and a rabbi. Since then, the organization has mobilized more than 2.6 million volunteers and raised \$4.8 billion across 1,800 local United Ways in 40 countries and territories, ranking United Way as the world's largest privately funded nonprofit organization.

Each local United Way focuses on the issues that matter most in that community, with resources and global experiences from United Way Worldwide for support. United Way of St. Lucie & Okeehcobee has served St. Lucie County for close to 60 years and recently expanded into Okeechobee County. We focus on four impact areas: basic needs, education, financial stability and health. We fund outcomedriven programs and serve as the backbone for initiatives that bring organizations together to solve complex social issues that no one organization can solve alone. In 2019, the Chronicle of Philanthropy voted United Way as America's favorite philanthropy, yet again.

021-2022 Highlights **52,147** residents enrolled in food assistance programs though our partner, Mustard Seed Ministries. 223 families were able to access financial assistance for child care to be able to seek employment or further their education.

1,539 uninsured or underinsured residents were able to access healthcare services provided by HANDS of St. Lucie County.

1,258 children received oral screenings to decrease poor oral health in children.
